BODRUM – HISARONU – BODRUM

DAY 1: Board Regina in **Bodrum**, where an impressive and beautifully preserved medieval castle built by the Knights of Rhodes guards the entrance to the town's dazzling bay. Bodrum's charm is well-known, attracting a diverse population of vacationers to stroll along its long palm-lined waterfront and enjoy the great cafe, restaurant and nightlife. You may want to wander through the landmark castle to see the underwater archeological museum exhibiting artifacts from ancient shipwrecks found locally in Greek and Turkish waters. Bodrum is also great for shopping with everything from its vibrant weekly markets to high end designer stores in the marina.

DAY 2: Early in the morning we cruise to the unspoilt **Palamutbuku Bay** on the Datca Peninsula. After lunch and time for swimming we anchor in the lovely bay of Ince Burun for dinner and an overnight stay.

DAY 3: After breakfast the boat will cruise to **Bencik Bay** which has a very narrow entrance but a spectacular view once one gets inside. Bencik is located at the narrowest part of the peninsula that divides the Hisarönü Gulf from the Gökova Gulf. Dinner and overnight stay will be at Aktur.

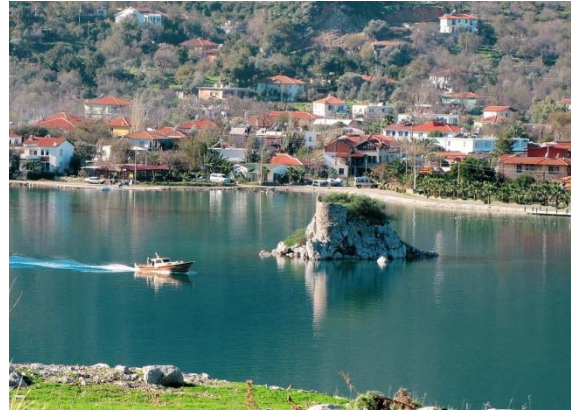

DAY 4 : Selimiye is a peaceful fishing village fringing a truly stunning bay just along the coast from Turgutkoy and Orhaniye. It now has a new public quay and seaside boardwalk, great for a walk exploring the restaurants and quaint shops dotted around the village. Discover the old village jail that is now a ruin, built on a small island in the middle of the bay.

DAY 5: Dirsek Buku is a timeless and tranquil spot to anchor and stay overnight. The peace and quiet, breathtaking scenery and clear waters are truly alluring. **Selimiye**, located to the southwest of Marmaris and 10 kilometers from the village of Orhaniye, is also a popular stop for yachts on the blue voyage and has very green environment.

Bozburun is surrounded by low, rocky hills and has a definite charm. The afternoon's sail will take you around the tip of the Loryma Peninsula and into Bozukkale. In Hellenistic times, Bozukkale was known Loryma and the city was a deme of the Rhodian Peraea. Your captain will anchor beneath the well-preserved walls of the ancient citadel and from here, it will be possible to swim or tender ashore to visit the ruins. The citadel provides an excellent vantage point from which to view the coastline and watch a fabulous Mediterranean sunset. Stay overnight in Bozukkale.

DAY 6: Enjoy a morning cruise to Datca, a small fishing town, where white-washed buildings hung with bougainvillea decorate the old town. Around the marina you will find bars, cafes and a wide selection of shops. The local eateries offer both fresh fish and classical Turkish cuisine. As you cruise out of Datca, you will find a choice of unspoiled bays for anchorage overnight

DAY 7 : After breakfast cruise along the coast with the Greek Dodecanese Islands in the distance to the ancient harbor of the ruined city of **Knidos**. This ancient city sitting on a clear-water cove at the tip of the Doric Peninsula was a center of art and culture in the 4th-century BC. Drop anchor in the larger of the two harbors, and enjoy lunch surrounded by the spectacular ruins of this ancient wealthy trading city. After lunch, go ashore to visit the site of Knidos, which includes city walls, two theatres, terraced streets, and the remains of several temples including the temple of Aphrodite. The surrounding Triopian cliffs are covered in rosemary and myrtle, and there is a theater and stoa at the water's edge. There is an additional entrance fee for all to visit Knidos paid at the gate.
